**WHAT ARE WE LEARNING THIS HALF TERM?**

**Spring Term 1**

Our topic this half term is "Super Skies" where children will learn about different seasons and types of weather. We'll be taking a look at the weather each day in the UK and noticing all the changes the seasons bring. We will discuss extreme weathers and hot/cold climates and construct windmills on our WOW day!

**Make & Create!**

Find a weather picture you like created by a famous artist. Be ready to describe the image, say how it makes you feel and why you like it.



**Clothes for seasons**

Divide a page into four blocks, and in each block write the name of each season. For each season, think about the clothes that you would wear. You can cut out and stick pictures from magazines or draw pictures to show the different clothes.



**Welly Walk**

Wrap up warm and go for a lovely walk. We are so lucky to have Ham Lands and Richmond Park on our doorstep. Take a photo of you on your walk. Write or draw what you have found.



**Write a poem**

Write a weather poem (e.g. shape, acrostic, rhyming, riddle).
