Below is a selection of activities that you may like to try related to our current topic. Each week we would like the children to record something in their home learning books, or bring into school something that they have created. There are suggestions and the children can record activities of their (and your) choice, however you may use these ideas if you would like to.

Seaside Interview

We are going to be learning about the seaside now and what seaside holidays used to be like in the past. Ask someone in your family if they've ever been to the seaside. Maybe they went when they were your age?

Find out:

Where did they go?

What did they see and do?

What did they like best?

Do they have any pictures that they would share with you?

Do they have any funny stories?



Record their answers in a short report or draw a picture of what they told you.

Safety by the Sea Poster

Write a list of things that children and adults should do to stay safe at the seaside.

Examples include - taking notice of warning signs, and children being with an adult when near water. Once complete, use your list and what you have learned to design a poster to help people stay safe when visiting the seaside. Include a title, bright colours, pictures and important information.



A walk by the water

If you can, take a coastal walk or a river walk along the Thames.

Spot physical (natural) and human (man-made) features on the route and take photographs. Write a diary entry about the trip and include a description of the features you saw and any other fun things that happened!

Seaside Senses Poem

Write a poem about what you might see, hear, smell, touch and taste at the seaside.

I see blue waves splish and splash,
I hear seagulls squawk and dash.

Bonus house points if you can make a rhyming poem!

Seaside in a shoebox

Create a mini seaside scene in a shoebox using materials at home (e.g., sand, shells, blue paper for water, drawings of fish or boats).

Label the features - pier, beach, cliffs, sea, sand



Your choice!

As it is the last home learning in Year 2 (how can that be?) for this task you can complete any activity of your choice!

For example:

- Memory jar drawing from Year 2
- Design a dream classroom
- Create a thank you card for someone who has helped you this year
- Summer reading passport - 5 books you want to read
