## Pupils will

- Talk at home about what they learn at school
- Do all their home learning and try to catch up with any work that they might miss or fail to complete
- Wear their school uniform with pride
- Always try to enjoy school and help other children to do the same
- Try to make a difference by being involved in the life of the school through sport, performances, special duties such as School Councillor, prefect etc
- Talk to their parent, teacher or Headteacher if they are worried about anything

## Families will

- Make sure their child arrives at school every day promptly at 8.55am and is collected on time at 3.15pm
- Report any unavoidable absence by 9.00am
- Accompany EYFS child into class and encourage KS1 and KS2 pupils to make their way into class independently
- Make sure that their child wears the correct school uniform
- Support the Christian ethos of the school and encourage my child to follow the School Faith ID
- Give their child every help with his/her school work
- Work with the school to ensure that their child behaves well and enjoys their learning
- Encourage their child to work hard, do all home learning tasks and listen to their child read everyday
- Attend all Learning Conversations and discussions about their child's progress at school
- Reply to school correspondence
- Talk to the school if my child is worried about attending school or if something happens to affect my child's learning
- Talk to the class teacher or the Headteacher if they have any concerns
